THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

BEHOLD, THE LAMB OF GOD

"Behold, the Lamb of God!" We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there's a good chance that many Roman Catholics do not know who in the Bible originally spoke it.

The phrase appears only in the Gospel of John, by John the Baptist. Upon seeing Jesus, he says, "Behold, the Lamb of God!"

It is one of the most important and misunderstood lines in all of Christian Scriptures. If you asked someone what this phrase means, you would, most likely, get an answer like this ..."it means that He is gentle and humble and good, like a lamb."

But, for a first century Jew, the phrase had little if anything to do with that. It had to do with sacrifice. It meant that Jesus was someone who was destined to be sacrificed as a sin offering to God.

John the Baptist's characterization of Jesus as the *Lamb* of *God* has to do with temple sacrifice. He will be the one who offers the final and definitive sacrifice which reconciles divinity and humanity.

And, in this, we will find our salvation.

In the late 1800s, French artist William Bouguereau painted this immaculate depiction of Our Lady holding the resting Christ Child and a spotless white lamb in her arms. Women, young children and lambs are all symbols of innocence.

This is a beautiful rendition of the innocence of the Lamb of God, bringing to mind the Bible verse and Mass proclamation: "Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!" (John 1:29).

Mary's gentleness and tender glance upon her sleeping Son shows us the love and adoration we, too, are to give our Lord – He who became man for our sake.

HERE I AM, LORD

Here I am, Lord, is a modern Christian hymn. Its main inspirations are 1 Samuel 3, our First Reading from today, where the Lord calls Samuel – Then the Lord called Samuel. Samuel answered, "Here I am," and Isaiah 6, where the Lord calls Isaiah – Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

The narrator changes between the Lord (the verses) and those He calls (the chorus). In some Churches, this is performed as the choir singing the verses, with the congregation answering with the chorus.

WHAT IS ORDINARY TIME?

The Liturgical Calendar gives us a full picture of the Church year. It shows the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, and Easter. Each season is highlighted in its appropriate color.

We have just started what the Church refers to as Ordinary Time.

There's nothing ordinary about Ordinary Time – it's a time set aside for reflecting on and celebrating our call to follow Jesus day by day.

Ordinary Time comprises the longest season of the Church year. This is the season when the great mysteries of salvation unfold in all their depth and richness. At this time, we explore, nuance by nuance, virtue by virtue, the facets of belonging to Jesus' Kingdom. The God who sent Jesus to save all of us from darkness and death is revealed in splendor.

We return to using green vestments during Ordinary Time. Changing colors gives a sense of progress of faith through the Church's calendar. Green is new growth, evergreens, green grass, glistening emeralds, ripening pears. It suggests renewal, healing, fertility, peace, and harmony.

The Church has a vigorous life – past, present, and future. The Church calendar guides us throughout the year, taking us from season to season in an ongoing effort to form us into God's Kingdom here on Earth, and lead us to His Kingdom in Heaven.
