# THE THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME FISHERS OF MEN



The phrase, "fishers of men," is one of the most well-known lines in the entire New Testament, and the most important metaphor for **evangelism**.

The image probably had an important role in the adoption of the *lchthys* (see above) as a symbol of early Christianity. The reference has also often been moved from the disciples to Jesus, with Him being called the "fisher of men." The image of Jesus as a fisherman is second only to that of Jesus as a shepherd.

The translation "fishers of men" is well-known but not wholly accurate. In Greek, it is halieis anthropon, but modern scholars realize that anthropon does not just refer to men, but to all of humanity. The basic interpretation of the metaphor as referring to the disciples working to catch souls for Jesus as they had previously caught fish is universally agreed upon.

A "fisher of men" is a person who is a witness for Jesus, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It is a person who is constantly sharing God's love and the Gospel.

A "fisher of men" is someone who has the same heart as God for lost people. He or she has God's love and desire and passion to see lost people come to have a reconciled relationship with God and eternal life. We need God to touch our hearts and place His love and passion for lost people into us.

A "fisher of men" is someone who is actively sharing the Gospel with others in their daily life (you do not need to be a full time servant like a pastor or missionary).

A "fisher of men" is a person who continually prays for and looks for opportunities to share the Good News of Jesus, with as many people as they can.

# FOLLOW ME, AND I WILL MAKE YOU FISHERS OF MEN Matthew 4:12-23

The fishers of men verse in today's Gospel helps us understand what Jesus came to do. He did not call us to become simply believers, but followers who make disciples.

#### LET'S GO FISHING!

Fishing would be easy if we could just put our nets by the water and have the fish jump into them! But, that's not how it works. You must wade out into the water, or get into a boat and go farther from shore. If you are a fisherman, you live by the sea and spend your time there. Here are four excellent suggestions that may help you become a true "fisher of men" as Jesus intended.

### 1. Go where the fish are.

Are you going where the "fish" are? If you only spend time with other Christians, you'll have little chance to interact with non-believers. Intentionally choose activities or hobbies that put you in contact with people in your neighborhood or community. Grow friendships and relationships with a wider circle of people, and you'll have more chances to go "fishing."

## 2. Cast your nets.

It wasn't enough for Peter and Andrew to take their boat out to the middle of the lake. To catch fish, they had to throw their nets into the water. For us, "casting our nets" means getting the message out. There are many ways to share the Gospel. We can tell people verbally; we can share with friends or even strangers via e-mail or the Internet, etc. Along with this, we must live our lives in a way that shows the truth we speak. Jesus said, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and give glory to your Father who is in Heaven" (Matthew 5:16). Our good works are not the Gospel, but when, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we love and care for others, it shows that the Gospel has the power to change lives, and others will want what we have.

# 3. Obey the Lord.

In John 21, after His Resurrection, Jesus came to some of the disciples who had fished unsuccessfully all night. He told them to throw their nets on the other side of the boat – an act that seemed to them to make no sense, but which brought a great catch. As you walk closely with God, you may sense His Spirit telling you to do or say something that may make no sense to you. Obey the Lord. This may be His way of bringing someone to come to know Him.

### 4. Walk with Jesus.

During the three years of Jesus' earthly ministry, the disciples did everything with Him – they walked, talked, and ate with Him. They not only listened to His words, but they observed and imitated the Living Word. This (and the Holy Spirit) prepared them to take the Gospel to the ends (kindly, continue ...)

of the earth. Jesus told us in John 15:4, "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me." (The word "abide" means to be connected.) Though we don't have Jesus in the flesh, He tells us in John 16:7 "Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send Him to you." Through the presence of the Holy Spirit, WE can walk with Jesus every day!

So, as Jesus calls, are you willing to do what the disciples did, and make fishing your highest priority and your true calling? As you consider and act on these principles, the Lord Jesus can make you into a true "fisher of men" for His glory.

#### THE APOSTLES

The events in today's Gospel, tell us something important about the Apostles that we may not have thought of.

It is likely that Peter, Andrew and the others had wives, and possibly children. What must it have meant for them to answer Jesus' summons to *Follow Him?* 

They had families and homes for which provisions had to be made; and yet the call to be *fishers of men* demanded their total commitment to Jesus. It cannot have been easy for anyone, especially the family members.

But we know that they left everything – their occupations and families – in an instant. *They abandoned their nets and followed Him.* 

Now, that's faith!!

"and suddenly a light from Heaven shined round about him. And falling on the ground, he heard a voice saying to him: Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? Who said: Who art thou, Lord? And He: I am Jesus whom thou persecutest. " Acts 9: 3-5

We celebrate the Conversion of Paul on January 25th.

The conversion of St. Paul has been a favorite theme for artists. There are certainly many other paintings of Paul and his adventures, but it's certainly hard to beat the drama of Heaven's light lighting Paul up after knocking him from his horse!

St. Paul's entire life can be explained in terms of one experience – his meeting with Jesus on the road to Damascus.

In an instant, Paul's life became a tireless proclaiming and living out of the message of the cross. From then on, Paul's only work was to "present everyone perfect in Christ. For this I labor and struggle, in accord with the exercise of His power working within me" (Colossians 1:28b-29).

Yet, why would Jesus select the likes of Paul? There were certainly other devoted followers of Jesus available in those early days of the Church – followers ready to give their lives to proclaim Jesus Christ as Savior of the World.

But, Jesus picked a Pharisee saying, "This man is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before Gentiles, Kings and Israelites" (Acts 9:15).

God selected <u>this</u> man who had a strong hatred of all Jesus stood for, a man who went into the house of Christians and "dragging out men and women," then "handed them over for imprisonment" (Acts 8:3b).

<u>This</u> man became God's chosen instrument to spread the message of Jesus across the Middle East and parts of Europe.


