## THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

## ASH WEDNESDAY IS FEBRUARY 14

Ash Wednesday is unique because it signals the beginning of Lent, the Church's special time of confession and renewal in preparation for Easter. It is what Christians are all about.

The symbols of Ash Wednesday touch us in a powerful way. When we hear the words, *"Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return,"* we are reminded of our vulnerability and utter dependence on God.

We all know in our hearts that the cross of Jesus Christ is the only way to salvation. We also know how difficult it is to internalize this truth, to pick up the cross daily and live it in all of life's circumstances. We know we need more prayer and discipline in our life, more genuine concern for others and less self-centeredness, more involvement in Church and community. So, we get our ashes, and turn back to the Lord.

People wear the cross of ashes on their foreheads without embarrassment or shame. It's like a badge of identification, reminding Catholics that we need to go back to being who we are supposed to be, fully and totally Christian.

It is as if Catholics are saying, *"I'm Catholic and proud of it. I may not be the best or greatest. I may slack off a little on my Church attendance and commitments. I have my faults and sins. But I'm not a bad person. I know deep down that being Christian is the way to live and I'm going to try again."* 

And, now is the perfect time.



#### ASH WEDNESDAY IS FEBRUARY 14th

Valentine's Day, February 14<sup>th</sup>, falls on Ash Wednesday this year. They're calling it a "conflict" for Catholics, leaving many wondering what to do.

Both are significant days in our Catholic calendar. The conflict comes because Ash Wednesday is a solemn day of prayer and penance – no meat, light meals, no snacking between meals – and St. Valentine's Day is a festive occasion – chocolates, dressing up and going out, and usually a nice meal.

The answer is that Ash Wednesday has precedence, and the coincidence of St. Valentine's Day would not lift for us the duty of fasting and self-denial.

Yet, a more positive way to look at it is that both days center on the *heart*.

The very symbol of St. Valentine's Day is the heart, the icon of love, especially the romantic love between a man and a woman. We'll send cards and boxes of sweets that are both heart-shaped.

Ash Wednesday, the first of forty days of prayer, penance, and charity we call Lent, leading us to Holy Week and Easter, is also about the heart: a heart called sacred, wounded by unreturned love, broken by callousness and selfishness: the heart *of Jesus*.

*This* heart is on fire with love for us, but surrounded by a crown of thorns. It is the love of *this* heart from which all true love flows. It is *this* Sacred Heart we trust this Wednesday; it is *this* Heart we turn to through our repentance and acts of sacrifice and atonement this Wednesday.

St. Valentine willingly bows to this Sacred Heart, for which even he lovingly gave his life eighteen centuries ago.

So, please consider making your Valentine dinner reservations for Tuesday or Thursday evening.

"But you, my Lord, are a God of compassion and mercy; you are very patient and full of faithful love." Psalm 86:15


"See what kind of love the Father has given to us in that we should be called God's children, and that is what we are!" 1 John 3:1

## LENTEN REGULATIONS ON **FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

During Lent, the Church calls the faithful to bring a spirit of penance into their lives through fasting and abstinence.

Abstinence from eating meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59 years of age. Those bound by fasting may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Those who are not specifically obliged to fast or to abstain are encouraged to join in those disciplines to the extent they are able.

The season of Lent culminates in the celebration of the Easter Triduum of the Lord's Last Supper, Passion, Death and Resurrection. Holy Thursday this year is March 28<sup>th</sup>. Good Friday is March 29<sup>th</sup>. The Easter Vigil of the Lord's Resurrection is March 30<sup>th</sup>. Easter Sunday is March 31<sup>st</sup>.
