

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY SERVICE TODAY AT 3 PM

Please join us for a special Divine Mercy Service in the Church this Sunday at 3 PM.

We meditate upon God's infinite, merciful love – most powerfully revealed in Jesus' passion, death and resurrection – in a special way during the seasons of Lent and Easter. And, to crown these most Holy Days, we have been given the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday.

The message of Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

In the words of St. John Paul II, "There is nothing more that man needs than Divine Mercy – that love which is benevolent, which is compassionate, which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God."

May this Feast Day be an occasion to ask for the grace to see what God has done for us and is doing for us; and the grace to see that our very lives are the work of His mercy.

OUR COVER ARTWORK THE VIRGIN OF THE ANNUNCIATION POMPEO BATONI 1707-1787

In this small devotional painting, the young Virgin appears both girlishly tender and classically beautiful. Her hands held humbly against her breast and her soft, downcast eyes reflect her readiness to follow the Will of God.

The Virgin is presented close-up in three-quarter profile, illuminated from the front against a dark background. Coming from the top left of the picture, the light gives her face definition and draws attention to her clasped hands. The Virgin's mild and humble attitude of prayer also serves as a model, urging the viewer to follow her example. Her deep blue cloak and reddish dress is mirrored in the soft red of her cheeks and bluish reflections on her eyelids. Her veil-like headscarf plays gracefully around her head and shoulder.

Pompeo Batoni, an artist who was held in the highest esteem in his day, was an important forerunner of the new Classical style. With this beautiful painting, it is easy to see why.

The Angelus

The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary. And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. Hail Mary, etc.

THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD MONDAY, APRIL 8th

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord celebrates the Angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary, his announcement that the Blessed Virgin had been chosen to be the Mother of Our Lord, and Mary's *fiat*, her willing acceptance of God's Holy Plan.

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your Word." Then the Angel departed from her" (Luke 1:26-38).

When Mary spoke those few words, human history was forever changed. They came from within the heart of a young Jewish girl who was in love with the God of her Fathers - Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. She was a woman of deep, living faith. A woman of prayer.

Mary's "Yes" is called the *fiat*: in Latin, "*Let it be done*." Mary's *fiat* was spoken from a heart filled with love for God. Her words proceeded from her humble, surrendered heart – she was able to completely surrender herself in love, to love, and be filled with His Love for others.

Mary, in her selflessness, was open to the Angel's visit. The encounter between Mary and the Angel opens up the meaning of our own lives, by shedding light on *our* call to share in God's loving plan.

This little Virgin of Nazareth teaches us how to live our Christian life. When the Angel of the Lord appeared, bearing the message and calling her to a special mission, Mary said, "Yes."

We must all say "Yes" as well and believe that "nothing is impossible with God."

Mary's Magnificat

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for He has looked with favor on His lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and Holy is His Name.

He has mercy on those who fear Him in every generation.

He has shown the strength of His arm, He has scattered the proud in their conceit.

> He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich He has sent away empty.

He has come to the help of His servant Israel for He has remembered His promise of mercy, the promise He made to our fathers, to Abraham and His children forever. Amen.



JESUS, I TRUST IN YOU SISTER MARIA FAUSTINA KOWALSKA

On February 22, 1931 in a Convent in Warsaw, Poland, Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska had a vision of Jesus, wearing a white garment with red and pale rays coming from His Sacred Heart.

In her diary, Sister Faustina writes – "In the evening, when I was in my cell, I became aware of the Lord Jesus clothed in a white garment. One hand was raised in blessing, the other was touching the garment at the breast. From the opening of the garment at the breast, there came forth two large rays, one red and the other pale. In silence, I gazed intently at the Lord; my soul was overwhelmed with fear, but also with great joy. After a while, Jesus said to me, 'Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with these words inscribed below: "Jesus, I trust in you," in Polish – Jezu, ufam Tobie."


According to her diary, the red ray is a symbol of the blood Jesus shed for us, and the pale ray symbolizes purification – some more recent versions of the painting shown above depict this ray more of a light blue for water/baptism.

An artist was brought in and followed her direction, but it is said that, when Sister Faustina came to view the progress of the painting, she wept over how poorly conveyed Jesus' beauty was in comparison with her visions. Our Lord assured her in subsequent visions that it was not in the artist's brush that the power of this image would be evident, but in the work it would do within the souls of those who honored it.

The painting above currently hangs in the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Vilnius, Lithuania. It was first displayed in public during Easter ceremonies in April 1934.

After the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska in April 2000 by Pope John Paul II, the devotion to the Divine Mercy and the popularity of this image increased dramatically. As part of the canonization, Pope John Paul II also declared the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, as Christ, in Sister Faustina's visions, had expressed His desire for this feast to be celebrated.
